We decided a change was in order after five years at Val Taro and finding a different venue suitable for the Irons was not an easy task, however:*

*We invite you to this year's Annual Christmas Dinner at Nueva Costa Dorada, Spanish Bar and Restaurant 47-55 Hanway Street, London W1T 1UX, located 2 minutes walk from Tottenham Court Road Tube Station, on Saturday 8th December 2007. From Tottenham Court Road tube station walk in a northerly direction up Tottenham Court road, and take the first left into Hanway Street, the restaurant is approximately 50 yards on the left hand side. We would like people to arrive for 8pm to sit down to eat at 8.30pm however there is a bar area for any people who arrive early, so people can sit and chat beforehand. The cost of the meal is £36 per person and does not include Wine. This price includes the three Course menu of £29.95 plus the Service Charge and £2 for the entertainment. The entertainment is top class Flamenco Dancing and is extraordinarily well performed as we have already seen, so the venue will have a bit more atmosphere and remains open until 3am for any late partygoers! We hope to see as many of you there as possible.*

## Brighton Lesbian and Gay Sports Society – Open Golf event as part of Brighton Pride

The golf section of BLAGSS is fairly new and the take up of entries to this event was not as high as the organizers hoped. In the main 18 hole event there were 18 entries, 8 men and 10 women. Of the 8 men, six are members of Irons and it was therefore scarcely surprising that we managed to come first, second, third and so on!

The event took place at Waterhall Golf Club, just north of Hove on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> August. This is a Council owned and run course and I'm afraid rather suffers from minimal maintenance, so the fairways were like semi rough, and the rough itself, unspeakable, although the greens were actually not too bad. Waterhall is only 5,200 yards and although one of our members commented in advance it was going to be like a pitch and putt course with everyone getting 50 points plus, it certainly didn't play that way.

Of particular horror was the nearest-the-pin 15<sup>th</sup> hole, which even Tiger Woods would have had trouble staying on! Only about 100 yards, but sharply downhill, you had to carry a large bunker in front of the green and even if you did this there was little space and a sharp slope down to the green which made the ball run off the back. Pitching the green was not really an option as it was not soft and the ball would bounce off. I don't recall that anyone stayed on and won nearest-the-pin.

For the men, Will P came first thanks to an outrageous birdie putt on the 18<sup>th</sup>, where three-putting was otherwise a definite possibility. A good thing really, since the Secretary (who was under strict instructions from his partner not to win for fear of attendant publicity!) came second and only two shots behind, having just lost a ball in the middle of the "hayfield" 16<sup>th</sup> fairway.

The buffet which followed was very good and plentiful which rather pleasantly surprised some of us who had played a practice round the day before and got back gasping for a drink, only to find the clubhouse shuttered and barred at 3.45!!

The two courses were in good condition and were of equal quality and quite appropriate for the society in as much as the fairways were wide, the rough short and there were a few long carries.
